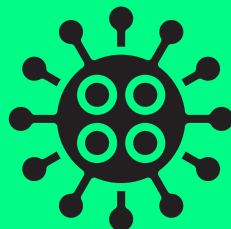


RESOURCES DURING THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC
